# **HPAI** Preparedness

#### **Cleaning and Disinfection**

• All previously HPAI Infected Premises must be cleaned and disinfected.

• Cleaning and disinfection practices during an outbreak should focus on HPAI virus elimination in a cost effective manner.

• Each of these premises requires a *written* C&D plan approved by State Animal Health Officials and USDA-APHIS. *Approval is required for reimbursement*.

Plan Requirements:

✓ Identify the area, structures and equipment to be included in the C&D process.

Plan Requirements cont'd:

✓ Describe the Preparation phase that includes:

- Removal of composted litter and mortality from the houses
- Removal of all feed from feed bins and tracks, disassemble if appropriate to facilitate C&D
- Repair all openings in buildings where wild animals or birds can enter buildings
- Removal of vegetation from around buildings
- Drain any standing water around buildings
- Establish rodent and insect control program
- Empty watering system, disassemble if appropriate to facilitate C&D

Plan Requirements cont'd:

✓ Describe the cleaning method to be used:

- Cleaning options:
  - Dry cleaning- removal of gross contamination, organic material, and debris from the premises, via mechanical means such as sweeping and/or
  - Wet cleaning- use of water and soap or detergent

Plan Requirements cont'd:

✓ Describe the disinfection method to be used:

- Disinfection options:
  - Wet disinfection with EPA Approved, California Registered disinfectant
  - **Drying and Heating** (100-120 F for 7 days- at least 3 days must be consecutive days drying and heating of the 7 days total)
  - Fumigation or Alternative Science Based Methods (If APHIS is paying for service then APHIS must approve prior to application to be reimbursed)
- Note: a premises may require a combination of methods, but at least one cleaning and one disinfection option must be used.

For premises that can't be cleaned and disinfected:

- Unusual circumstance
- Fallowing for 120 days or a period recommended by Incident Command
- Length will vary, depending on temperature and season
- Reserved for use on premises that need to be completely repaired or destroyed in order to be effectively cleaned and disinfected.

- While traditionally wet cleaning and disinfection has been performed during past incidents, dry cleaning and heating of houses may be the preferred approach during a widespread HPAI outbreak.
- Any methods selected should consider the characteristics of the premises/ houses and other factors that may impact the effectiveness of the HPAI virus elimination activities.
